How to Register Using Your X2 Aspen account

1. Log into X2 Aspen (all present staff should have an X2 account)
2. Change your View to the Staff View (you will know you are there when the first tab says MY INFO)
3. Click the PD Tab then click the Offerings Side-Tab
4. Under Options, choose SUBMIT ACTIVITY REQUEST
5. On the Activity Request Workflow Wizard, select your PD Plan (everyone has one) in Step 1 followed by Next.
6. On Step 2, choose the section of the course you wish to register for and any comments you may have followed by Next
7. On Step 3, click FINISH and you will receive an email confirmation when you are fully enrolled. You can also check the Offerings Side-Tab to also see any status changes.
